Inclusion Corner

Welcome to the Inclusion Corner! Where we give you a bite-sized topic on inclusive practices! This month's topic: Why Inclusion?

Inclusive practices in education have come a long way in a relatively short time, and many of us likely remember when EX-clusive practices were the norm. While there is plenty of room for improvement when it comes to inclusive and equitable educational practices, it is important to reflect on this progress and even more important to understand how all children benefit from inclusive practices.

Some key benefits of inclusive classrooms:

- Better long term outcomes – Children with disabilities who learn in inclusive classrooms have better school attendance, stronger math and reading skills, and a more positive outlook on education.
- Support for all – Inclusive classrooms have support in place to make learning accessible for everyone, which benefits children with disabilities AND their peers.
- Promoting acceptance – Children who spend time in diverse groups of learners develop stronger empathy, higher self-esteem, and friendship skills, which they carry into adulthood.
- Affirming differences – Children with and without disabilities in inclusive settings learn that while everyone is different, we all have strengths and everyone can be successful with the right support.
- Professional growth – General education teachers who work in inclusive classrooms often team up with special education teachers, providing opportunities to learn new strategies and grow as an educator.

Business Corner

Need More Time to File Your Business Taxes? Here's How to Get an Extension!

If you're a business owner and need extra time to file your tax return, follow these simple steps to apply for an extension:

Know Your Form:

Use Form 7004 to request an automatic 6-month extension to file certain business income tax, information, and other returns.

When To File

Generally, Form 7004 must be filed on or before the due date of the applicable tax return.

Submit Before the Deadline: April 15

Pay Any Estimated Taxes – An extension gives you more time to file, not pay! Avoid penalties by making a payment if needed.

How and Where to File

Form 7004 can be filed electronically for most returns. However, Form 7004 cannot be filed electronically for Forms 8612, 8613, 8725, 8831, 8876, or 706-GS(D).

Blended Online CPR and First Aid Certification



First aid and CPR (cardio-pulmonary resuscitation) for children, infants, and adults. Current first aid and CPR certifications are required for certified and registered family child care providers as well as for some staff in certified child care centers. This training meets CCLD licensing requirements as well as requirements for the ODHS enhanced rate.

Do you need to know the training requirements for renewing your Registered Family Child Care license?

You will need:

- Ten hours of training for the renewal of a registered family child care license. This training must be taken during the two years preceding the renewal date.
- At least six clock hours of the ten hours of training must be related to child development.
- Minimum of one hour in the category of Health, Safety and Nutrition (HSN) must be taken each calendar year.

The required ten hours of training is in addition to the other training specifically required for a registered family child care license (i.e. First Aid, Infant/Child CPR, Oregon Food Handler's, Recognizing and Reporting Child Abuse and Neglect, Introduction to Child Care Health and Safety, and Child Care Licensing Division (CCLD) approved safe sleep training).

Training **MUST** be related to the Core Knowledge Categories in the Oregon Registry in order to count toward the ten hour training requirement.

These categories are:

- Diversity (DIV)
- Families & Community Systems (FCS)
- Human Growth and Development (HGD)
- Health, Safety and Nutrition (HSN)*
- Learning Environments & Curriculum (LEC)
- Observation and Assessment (OA)
- Special Needs (SN)
- Understanding & Guiding Behavior (UGB)



*Note: HSN is identified as "Child Development" except for the required safety set trainings (Recognizing and Reporting Child Abuse and Neglect, CPR, First Aid, and Food Handlers). These will appear in the "Other" category on your CCLD Staff Qualifications and Training Log.

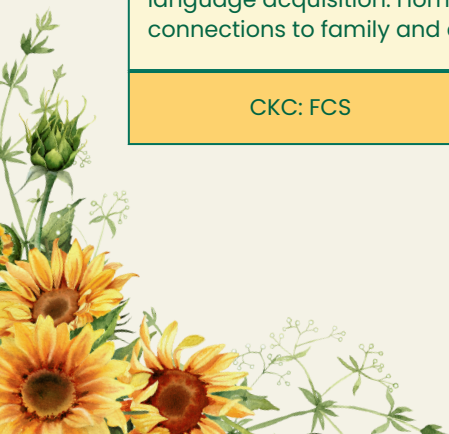

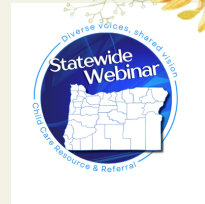
